

Hello and welcome to WOW – the walk to school challenge!

WOW is one of the UK's leading behaviour-change initiatives, brought to you by Living Streets Scotland, part of the UK charity for everyday walking. It's great to have your school on board for this year's challenge.

This pupil-led initiative will see children digitally record how they get to school every day. If they travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot, Park and Stride or hop off) at least once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a WOW badge. It's that easy!

The WOW Champion and your welcome pack

First, appoint a 'WOW Champion', someone within the school who will **lead on the initiative**. This WOW Welcome Pack is split into two parts:

1. Resources for WOW Champion

- Welcome guide provides help on getting started and links supporting digital resources.
- WOW poster put it up and let everyone know you're a WOW school!

2. Information for classroom staff

- 25 handy guides to be shared with each class don't forget to add the school's threeword classroom access code first.
- Inclusivity leaflet information on how to adapt WOW in instances where pupils can't travel actively to school to ensure they can still take part and earn badges. Get in touch or visit our website to find out more.

The badges have all been designed by pupils across the UK as part of our annual WOW Badge Design Competition. They are made in Cornwall from material that was otherwise destined for landfill, including fridge trays, plastic plates and yoghurt pot off-cuts.
