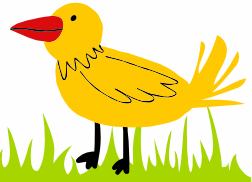

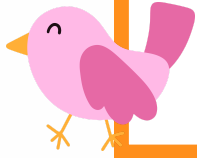


Sensory scavenger hunt

Find a green leaf

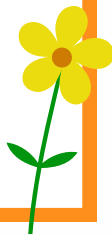
Touch a rock
