This guide is like an ideas factory, full of activities to help your school promote WOW and get everyone, including the wider school community, involved in walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling to school.

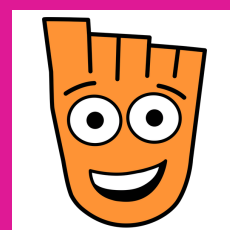

WOW Ambassadors (and other pupil groups) should look out for the Strider icon as this indicates where pupils can get involved and really make a difference.

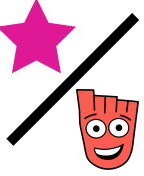

	Check WOW engagement	Keep an eye on how engaged each class is on the WOW Travel Tracker - the leaderboards are great for this. How could you get classes with low engagement more involved?	Check engagement through the Reports tab of your Travel Tracker admin account
	Create and update a WOW noticeboard	Keep your display current with the WOW badges for each month, your Class of the Month, WOW Ambassador updates, and much more!	Explore our WOW Launch Resources and share on your website or display board
	Celebrate your WOW badge winners and WOW Class of the Month	You could also integrate WOW into your existing rewards system (e.g. house points) Share the Class of the Month through your social media channels, in your school newsletter or as part of a WOW noticeboard. 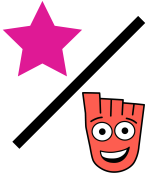

	Mini-Strider adventures	Give pupils and their families the opportunity to take mini-Strider home for the weekend and keep a diary of their walking and wheeling adventures together.	If you don't already have a mini-Strider, they are available through our shop
	Take part in Walk to School Week	Walk to School Week is held in May every year, as part of National Walking Month. Plan annual events to encourage everyone to travel actively for the week.	Find out more about Walk to School Week and view our Events Calendar
	Take part in the WOW Design Competition	The competition to create the next year's WOW designs takes place every spring term, launching in January. Could your WOW Ambassadors run a mini competition in school?	Visit WOW Design Competition
	Share our family activity resources	You could share resources to encourage families to join the walk and wheel to school and/or share a link to our supporters page to encourage families to follow our work.	Download Family Resources Booklet , share our Parents and Carers and Supporters pages

	Incorporate WOW into the school curriculum	Review our WOW lesson plans or simply use your Travel Tracker data as part of your lessons e.g. Maths, Geography, PSHE etc.	Explore our Lesson Plans
	Carry out a walking and wheeling review	Carry out a School Route Audit (SRA) with a small group of pupils to assess the walking route around your school and identify any barriers to walking.	Explore our School Route Audit page
	Hold a car-free day	This could be held during Walk to School Week, Earth Day, Clean Air Day, International Car Free Day, or International Walk to School Month.	View our Events Calendar
	Hold a virtual walk and wheel challenge	Take on an additional challenge with a virtual walk and wheel to 'reach the top of Ben Nevis' or 'walk and wheel to the moon!'.	There are lots of free online resources to help you with this
	Develop a fun walking route	Pupils could create their own walking and wheeling route around school e.g. a sensory route.	See what you can find on your walk from our Scavenger Hunt
	Run an awareness-raising campaign	WOW Ambassadors could plan, develop and deliver an awareness-raising campaign around air quality, anti-idling, pavement parking or speed limits.	Check out our Pavement Parking , Air Pollution , and Clear Air Day pages
	Encourage other schools to get involved with WOW	Tell local schools, or schools within your Academy Trust, about the benefits of WOW. You can then compete against them in the WOW Top Ten challenge!	Schools can express their interest and find out if they are eligible for funding



WANT TO DO MORE?

Outside school:

COMMUNITY

Find a local community walking group and arrange a walk together. What can you learn from one another about the area?

PRESENT

At your next parent/teacher meeting (PTA), give a presentation on why your school is taking part in the WOW challenge to help raise awareness and get more parents/carers on board.



PLAN

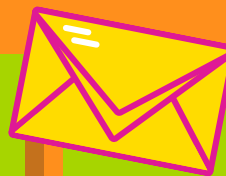
What are the main issues or areas of concern for your school? Work with your WOW Ambassadors, Senior Management Team, other staff, PTA and governors to create an action plan for the year to tackle them.

PREPARE

Observe the pavements around your school in icy conditions - are they safe? Do you have a grit bin nearby? Could you write to your local councillors and ask for help to keep your pavements safe and clear during the winter months?

CONNECT

Link up with your local WOW schools. Swap photos and share pupils' school journey stories. What barriers have they faced and how can your school learn from their experiences?



INVITE

Invite your local police officer or councillor to visit school at drop-off or pick-up times. Write and explain the issues and see what they can do to help.

At school:

SWAP

Ask your class to swap one car journey for an active trip over the weekend or during the holidays. Ask the pupils about their experiences.

EAT

Organise an Active Travel Breakfast! Start the school day with an active journey and a healthy breakfast. Invite the whole school to participate. Your local supermarket community champion may help with this.



COMMUNICATION

Get your pupils to talk to their families about their journeys to school. How was it different from today's journeys?

CLIMATE

Make sure you incorporate all your WOW activities and achievements into your Climate Action Plan.
